Policy Statement

This Policy is subject to any specific provisions of the Local Government Act or other relevant legislation or Union Agreement

Permissible uses for access to GEID hydrants include the following:

a) construction road compaction

b) construction dust control

- c) construction water main testing
- d) utility line flushing
- e) wellpoint dewatering installation
- f) road sweeping
- g) tanker truck filling

The Hydrant Use Permit and Special Notes will form part of the regulations for the sale of Bulk Water provided by the District.

Once all fees are paid and the written authorization (Permit) provided, the District can, at its sole discretion, cease the use of any or all hydrants.

The District, at its own discretion, will direct which hydrant is to be used, or at any time make changes. The District can and will regulate the time of day a hydrant can be used.

Daily Hydrant Use Permit Fees as detailed in GEID Miscellaneous Charge Bylaw and commercial rates for water use as detailed in GEID Tolls Bylaw will apply. Applicants are required to use the Meter Wagon provided by the District for the entire period of use. All water used must be metered.

Any damage to the Metering Wagon will be repaired at the Applicant's expense.

Bulk Water supplied by the District must only be used within the District's service area, and cannot be exported outside of the District.

A copy of the Applicant's Liability Insurance Coverage is to be provided prior to issuance of the Hydrant Use Permit. The Insurance Policy must show proof of coverage for a minimum of \$2 Million in Liability Insurance. The Insurance Policy must name Glenmore-Ellison Improvement District as an additional insured.

NOTE: This policy does not supersede or contravene any approved GEID Bylaws.
